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At Babeş-Bolyai University, the evaluation process is carried out online every semester, according to the operational procedures *Evaluation of teaching performance by UBB students attending full-time studies* and *Evaluation of teaching performance by UBB students attending distance learning programs*. The procedures were developed in 2014 and revised in 2017 (Administrative Council Decision no. 3.888 / 08 March 2017) and 2018 (Administrative Council Decision no. 16.506 / 24 September 2018), being completed with evaluation standards, criteria and indicators, as well as with measures for capitalizing on the results.

In both full-time education (IF) and partial time or distance learning (IDFR), evaluations are carried out by undergraduate and master's students, as well as by trainees of the Department for the Training of Teaching Staff (DPPD) programs, postgraduate programs (PU), and professional conversion programs (CP).

The questionnaires addressed to students and trainees in full-time studies cover lectures (Annex 1) and seminars / practical work (Annex 2) respectively. Questionnaires completed by students who declare that, during a semester, they have attended at least 50% of lectures / seminars / practical work are considered valid. The questionnaires for partial time and distance learning students cover the study areas studied (Annex 3).

The evaluation process is managed by the Qualitas Center. The assessment used for the application, academicinfo.ubbcluj.ro, ensures the anonymity of respondents because it does not associate personal data with a specific answer.

Assessment periods precede examination sessions, and at the end of each assessment period the questionnaires become inactive. Assessment results are available to the assessed teaching staff, the faculty/university management and the Qualitas' Center staff involved in the process, after the end of the examination sessions (including the retakes). Moreover, according to the Administration Council Decision no. 3806 of 25.02.2013, students who have completed the questionnaires have access to the individual results of the teaching staff they have evaluated, and the lecture owners will be able to view the results of the teaching staff holding the related seminars.




Figure 1. Number of assessed teaching units evaluated during the academic year 2022/2023, first semester




Figure 2. Number of valid completed questionnaires for the academic year 2022/2023, first semester




Figure 4. Percentage distribution of the completed questionnaires, by language of study, the academic year 2022/2023, first semester




Figure 5. Percentage distribution of the number of assessed study areas, by language of study, during the academic year 2022/2023, first semester




Figure 6. Percentage distribution of the teaching staff, by language of study, during the academic year 2022/2023, first semester




Figure 7. Percentage distribution of the number of students completing questionnaires, by language of study, during the academic year 2022/2023, first semester

✓ Percentage distribution by language of study of the students who completed questionnaires (*Figure 7*) largely corresponds to that of the number of students enrolled in the respective BBU programs and is almost identical to that of the completed questionnaires. The number of bachelor and master level students who completed the questionnaires is 6,460, of which 5,752 in full-time studies and 708 in partial time or distance Learning studies (*Table 4*).




Figure 8. Response rate (%) by language of study during academic year 2022/2023, first semester




Figure 9. Lecture and seminar/practical work assessment averages by language of study, undergraduate level, in the academic year 2022/2023, first semester




Figure 10. Lecture and seminar/practical work assessment averages by language of study, master level, during the 2022/2023 academic year, first semester

Partial Time and distance learning studies

At bachelor level, the assessment was carried out in 9 faculties and at master level, in 6 faculties. Similar to the assessments carried out for full-time education, master level students gave higher scores than bachelor level students (*Annex 9*). The averages of the Hungarian section³ were higher than of the Romanian one (*Annex 10*).
