Competitiveness No. 17/2022

The 2022-2023 edition of the <u>Centre for World University Ranking (CWUR)</u> ranked UBB as the first university in Romania and 895th internationally, based on a complex set of criteria that considers the quality of education, research and the employability of the graduates.



According to the newly published edition of the <u>Times Higher Education Impact Rankings</u> (which includes 1406 universities from 106 countries or regions), UBB is ranked in the 300-401st position, with an overall score of 73 out of the maximum 100 points possible. At a national level, UBB is ranked first together with the Bucharest University of Economic Studies.

For this edition of the ranking UBB collected and reported data for 7 individual Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), out of which UBB achieved the best score in SDG 4 – Quality of Education, where it is ranked 50th globally, and it is ranked first on the national level. The results obtained in each individual SDG on a national and global level are presented below:

Note: The '=' symbol signals the fact that multiple universities share the same rank for the respective position.

By decision <u>no.</u> 3876/11.04.2022, UBB's Administration Council approved the procedure for analyzing the similarity of doctoral theses defended between 1990-2016.

By decision <u>no. 48/11.04.2022</u>, UBB's Senate approved the completed and modified version of the policy for granting scholarships to students at a bachelor's and master's level.

By decision no. 4366/20.04.2022, UBB's Administration Council approved the operational procedure regarding the collection, processing and reporting of data for elaborating the annual institutional contract and the complementary contract for institutional funding.

Activities

The survey on the phenomenon of university dropout is underway and questionnaires are being completed via telephonic interviews. The results of the survey will be presented in a forthcoming study.

The institutional report on the evaluation of teachers and researchers by leadership has been finalized and awaits approval.

The Faculty of Sociology and Social Work, together with the Qualitas Centre, is launching a study in May entitled 'UBB Students' Perceptions of the Effects of the Covid-19 Pandemic on University Studies.' The research aims to identify the experiences and opinions of students related to the coronavirus pandemic, as well as the problems and difficulties they encountered.

The evaluation for assessing the quality of the educational process by students is underway. **Qualitas Centre** invites all students to complete the anonymous questionnaires using the **AcademicInfo platform**, or the mobile **UBBApp**, available on iOS and Android platforms. The evaluation periods are as follows:

Full-time education: 9 May – 29 May, 2022 Distance-learning and part-time education: 23 May – 5 June, 2022

Final years: 18 April – 15 May, 2022 Final years: 9 May – 22 May, 2022
